## Antique & Farm Stock Tractor Pull Rules & Regulations

1. Tractor must be registered before the beginning of its respective class. Drivers must sign the waver sheet before pulling.
2. Tractor must be pre-1960 for Antique classification. An exception must be approved by the committee or a track official.
3. Wheels can be filled (loaded) with calcium or other liquid, no traction chain, dual tire, diff lock or 4X4.
4. The hitch must be at the maximum 20" above ground.
5. Classes will be determined by the weight of the tractor and driver combined. It is the driver's responsibility to register the tractor in the proper class. 100 lbs grace will be allowed (a tractor competing in the 4500 lbs. class can weigh a maximum of 4600lbs including the driver).
6. The tractor must look "stock" with no modifications showing. The committee or track official, reserve the right to accept, refuse, remove a tractor from a class.
7. The speed limit for pulling is 4 MPH. If the tractor exceeds 4 MPH, the horn will sound once, if speed is exceeded again, the horn will sound again, and the tractor will be disqualified from the respective class.
8. The driver must remain seated during the pull.
9. Before each pull, the tractor must go to the scale where the weight and hitch height will be checked. If the tractor does not scale in, meet the set weight, or hitch height, it will be disqualified from its respective class.
10. The tractor can pull a maximum of 3 times in different classes or with different drivers in the same class.
11. If a weight or any other piece off the tractor falls off the tractor during the pull, the tractor will be disqualified from the respective class.
12. The committee or track official has the right to make changes or "bend" the rules at any time. If flagged by an official, **STOP the tractor immediately!**
13. Antique classes are (up to): 2500lbs, 3500lbs, 4500lbs, 5500lbs, 6500lbs, 7500lbs, 8500lbs, 9500lbs, 10500lbs, 11500lbs. if there is a demand for heavier class or *modified* class it can be created. In the case of only one heavy or one *modified* tractor will be allowed to pull in the nearest class but will not qualify. *Modified* tractors must be equipped with wheelie bars, no exceptions.
